National Politics

- **Ayush minister launched campaign to distribute AYUSH 64.**

Ayush minister has launched a massive nationwide campaign to distribute its poly herbal Ayurveda drugs AYUSH 64 and Kabasura Kudineer for covid -19 patients, who are at their home. It is a multi – stakeholders campaign to ensure that these medicines reach the needy in a transparent and efficient manner.

AYUSH -64 is an Ayurvedic formulation developed by central council for Research in Ayurvedic science (CCRAS) and Kabasura Kudineer is a classical siddha formulation.

- **Govt brings changes in customs Rules to boost trade facilitation.**

Govt has brought changes in the existing Customs (Import of Goods at concessional Rate of duty) Rules, IGCR 2017 to boost trade facilitation. The changes have been introduced by Central Board of indirect Taxes and customs through customs (import of Goods at concessional Rate of duty) amendment Rules, 2021. Importers who do not have any manufacturing facility can now avail IGCR. 2017 to import goods at concessional customs duty excluding gold, precious stones, etc.

- **Manisha Kapoor appointed as Vice president of ICAS.**

General secretary of Advertising Standards Council of India. Manisha Kapoor has been appointed to the executive Committee of international council for Advertising self-esteem Regulations (ICAS). She will hold one of the 4 VP on the executive Committee of ICAS. Other 3 are from Canada, US and world Federation of Advertisers. She will hold the office till 2023. ICAS: Global platform promoting responsible ads through self – regulatory standards set up by European Alliance in 2008

- **Malerkotla declared as 23rd District of Punjab.**

Punjab chief minister Amarinder Singh has declared Malerkotla as the 23rd district of Punjab on the occasion of Eid – Ul – Fitr , after long – pending demand of the people. He also announced Rs 500 crore medical college for Malerkotla , a women's college, a new bus stand and a women police station.

Malerkotla: Muslim – dominated area has been carved out of Sangrur district and is located nearly 35 km from district headquarters in Sangrur.

- **Ramesh Pokhriyal Nishank Conferred with international invincible Gold Medal.**

Ramesh Pokhriyal Nishank has been conferred with the international invincible gold Medal for 2021 for his extraordinary commitment and outstanding service to humanity through his writings, social and illustration public life at a two – day virtual session. He will receive the award by global Maharishi organization and its universities, on the occasion of Guru Purnima

(24 July 2021). The decision to award him was made by a high – powered committee under Dr Tony Nader.

- **MoTA signs MoU with Microsoft for Digital Transportation of Tribal schools**

Minister of Tribal Affairs (MoTA) has signed MoU with Microsoft on joint initiative for digital Transformation of Tribal schools like Eklavya Model Residential Schools (EMRS) and Ashram schools

Microsoft will make AI curriculum available to tribal students in both English and Hindi at all EMRS schools in both to skills educators and students in next – generation technologies.

In the first phase, 250 EMRS schools have been adopted by Microsoft out for intensive and master trainers.

- **Senior BJP Leader Chaman Lal Gupta passes away.**

Former Union Minister and senior BJP leader Professor Chaman Lal Gupta (86 years) passed due to post covid- 19 complications at his residence in Jammu. He was union minister of state for Defence, food processing and civil aviation. He was elected to J&K state Assembly in 1972 as a member of Jana Sangh. He was elected to Lok Sabha in 1998, and 1999 from Udhampur constituency. He was a member of J&K Vidhan Sabha from 2008 to 2014 as an MLA from Jammu west.

International Politics

- **Xi, Putin witness launch of biggest China-Russia nuclear energy project:**

Chinese President Xi Jinping and his Russian counterpart Vladimir Putin hailed the nuclear cooperation between the two neighbour countries. They virtually attended the launch ceremony of the biggest nuclear energy project. 4 nuclear plants that will be built in China will cost about USD 3 billion.

- **Pakistan PM Imran Khan's ruling party splits, parliament majority at risk**

Pakistan's Prime Minister Imran Khan's ruling party splits. A senior member of the ruling party has formed a separate group and has brought the existing parliament in a extreme risk.

- **Trump Organisation under criminal investigation: NY Attorney General**

New York Attorney General Letitia James said that it was working alongside by Manhattan Attorney in an ongoing criminal fraud investigation against Donald Trump has brought him and his family in pressure.

- **52,000 Palestinians take refuge in UN-run schools in Gaza, says UN report.**

A U.N. report said that 52,000 Palestinians took resort at schools run by U.N. relief and UNRWA in the Gaza Strip, as a round of probably heaviest fighting between the two countries Gaza and Israel since 2014 had lasted for over 9 days.

- **Manchester City delegated 2020-21 Chief Association champions:**

Manchester City has delegated Chief Alliance champions for the third time in four seasons after Manchester United collided with a 2-1 loss against Leicester. United began the century overwhelming English football, presently City is the power with five titles in 10 seasons and the greatest spenders on moves and pay rates.

- **Arjan Bhullar becomes first Indian-origin fighter to win MMA title:**

Arjan Bhullar became the first Indian-origin fighter to win a world title in a top-level MMA promotion when he beat Brandon Vera to become the heavyweight world champion at the Singapore-based One Championship.

- **India's Tejaswini Shankar Wins Sequential High Jump Titles In USA:**

Addressing Kansas State College, India's Tejaswini Shankar won consecutive men's high jump titles in the Large 12 outside Olympic style events Titles in Manhattan, USA. He is the third Indian to contend in the exceptionally aggressive USA circuit, the favorable place for some, US Olympic style events Olympians.

- **India Secures 14 decoration at 2021 Senior Asian Wrestling Title:**

The 2021 Senior Asian Wrestling Titles was held from April 13 to 18, 2021 in Almaty, Kazakhstan. The occasion was the 34th version of the Asian Wrestling Titles. India won 14 awards to remain in the third right on target the decoration table. The awards incorporate 5 Gold, 3 Silver and 6 Bronze Decorations. Iran and Kazakhstan beat the decoration count with 17 awards each.

International Sports

- **Karim Benzema recalled to French national team for Euro 2020 despite upcoming trial:-**

Karim Benzema has been recalled to the French national team for the first time in almost six years for the upcoming European Championships.

The 33-year-old striker has not played for his country since 2015 after he was suspended by the national team for his alleged involvement in a scheme to blackmail his former teammate Mathieu Valbuena.

- **What could happen if the Tokyo Olympics get cancelled?**

With a little over two months until the start of the Tokyo Olympics, the possibility of a cancellation looms large over the Games.

As Japan battles a fourth wave of coronavirus infections and a state of emergency in Tokyo and other prefectures remains in place until the end of the month, there is mounting pressure from health experts, business leaders and the Japanese public to call off the Games.

Last week, the Tokyo Medical Practitioners Association, an organization of about 6,000 doctors in Tokyo, penned a letter calling for a cancellation, while a petition which garnered 350,000 signatures in nine days in support of a cancellation has been submitted to organizers.

Also last week, the CEO of leading Japanese e-commerce company Rakuten said that holding the Games amid the pandemic amounts to a “suicide mission” – among the strongest opposition so far voiced by a business leader.

- **Liberty’s Ionescu records first career triple-double to down Lynx:-**

New York Liberty point guard Sabrina Ionescu tallied 26 points, 12 assists and 10 rebounds to record her first career triple-double in Tuesday’s 86-75 win over the Minnesota Lynx in the Women’s National Basketball Association.

Ionescu, a one-time protege of the late Kobe Bryant and the number one pick in the 2020 WNBA Draft, completed the feat in just her sixth game after an ankle injury cut short her debut season. The triple-double was the first by a Liberty player, and at 23-years-old Ionescu is the youngest player in league history to accomplish the feat.

- **Roger Federer and Serena Williams suffer shock defeats to dent French Open preparations:-**

Roger Federer and Serena Williams may be able to boast 43 grand slam singles titles between them, but both were left stunned by defeats within hours of each other on Tuesday.

In his first match since he made his injury comeback in March, Federer was beaten by Pablo Andújar at the Geneva Open, while Williams fell in straight sets to Katerina Siniakova in the Emilia-Romagna Open.

With the French Open set to begin on May 30, it’s hardly the ideal preparation for the year’s second grand slam. Speaking after his 6-4, 4-6, 6-4 defeat to world No. 75 Andújar, the 39-

year-old Federer said he's not even thinking about winning at Roland Garros as he continues his return after two knee surgeries in 2020.

- **India women to play day-night Test in Australia:-**

The Indian Women's Cricket team will play a day-night Test (with pink ball) on their tour of Australia later this year, the Indian cricket board announced on Thursday.

"Taking forward our commitment towards women's cricket, I am extremely pleased to announce that Team India @BCCIwomen will play in their first-ever pink ball day-night Test later this year in Australia," Jay Shah, the secretary of Board of Control for Cricket in India (BCCI), wrote on his Twitter handle.



Miscellaneous News

- **Cyclone 'Yass' forming in the Bay of Bengal.**

After the 2021's first cyclonic storm died down over the Udaipur district in southern Rajasthan on 19/05/2021, another cyclone is likely to make a landfall likely on 23rd or 24th May, 2021 currently gathering strength in Bay of Bengal.

The cyclone that will be called 'Yaas', a name was given by Oman. The Indian Meteorological Department warned of a likely formation of low-pressure area over Bay of Bengal next week. The sea surface temperature is around 31 degrees Celsius over the Bay of Bengal and all other oceanic and atmospheric conditions are favourable for the development of a cyclone.

- **Doctor refuses to wear mask inside supermarket.**

Dr. Srinivas Kakkilaya, a renowned doctor and an expert on public health was seen arguing with a supermarket staff in Jimmy's Super Mart in the Kadri area of Mangaluru for asking him to follow Covid-19 protocols and wear a mask. The doctor claimed that he had already recovered from Covid-19 and hence he need not wear a mask.

A case has been registered against him under Epidemic Act at East (Kadri) police station following his refusal to wear a mask while he went for shopping. The complaint was filed by Ryan Rosario, a partner of Jimmy's Super Mart Kadri at the police station.

- **Indian girl bagged a job at Microsoft with Rs. 2 crore package**

A lady from Hyderabad named Deepthi Narkuti will be working at Microsoft's headquarters in Seattle, the USA as a software development engineer grade-2 category.

She had completed her MS (Computers) from the University of Florida in May, 2021 and joined Microsoft on 17/05/2021. Her father, Dr. Venkanna is a forensic expert in the Hyderabad Police Commissionerate.

Deepthi received the highest annual salary out of 300 selected at the University of Florida.

- **Submerged car, murder spot, unknown sculpture is being found in Google Earth.**

Google Earth renders a 3D representation of Earth that is primarily based on satellite imagery. It allows a user to find addresses and coordinated using a mouse or a touch device. Google Earth is compatible with smartphones, laptops, desktops and tablets.

- **Priyanka Chopra raises Rs. 22 crores in Covid relief procuring 500 oxygen concentrators.**


