

International Sports

Rafael Nadal wins italian open after defeating Novak Djokovic

- Rafael Nadal (Spain) has won 10th Italian Open, after defeating world number -1 Novak Djokovic (Serbia) by 7-5, 1-6, 6-3
- He also equalled Djokovic's record of 36 ATP Masters 1000 titles
- The title also re-established Nadal as the overwhelming favorite for the French Open, where he will be aiming for an even harder-to-believe 144th title.
- Men's doubles: Nikola Pietrangeli and Mate Pavić.
- Women's doubles title: Sharon Fichman and Giuliana Olmos.

North Korea withdraws from 2022 World Cup qualifiers

- Asian Football Confederation has confirmed the withdrawal of North Korea from the Asian qualifiers for 2022 FIFA World Cup and 2023 AFC Asian Cup.
- Further details on the standing of the Asian qualifying group H, which includes North Korea, will be announced in due course.
- Prior to their withdrawal, North Korea ranked 4th in Group H, after 5 matches just one point behind group leaders Turkmenistan.
- The group also includes South Korea, Lebanon and Sri Lanka

Iga Swiatek won women's singles title of Italian open

- Polish teenager tennis player Iga Swiatek (19 years) has won the women's singles title of Italian Open.
- She defeated Czech Karolina Pliskova by 6-0, 6-0 with what is known as a 'double bagel' score in the summit clash in Rome that lasted just 46 minutes.
- She will move into the top 10 of WTA Rankings for the first time in her career after a ruthless performance in the Italian Open final against former world No. 1 Karolina Pliskova

2021 AIBA Men's world Boxing championship to be held from 26 October

- International Boxing Association (AIBA) has announced to conduct world Boxing championship from 26 October to 6 November in Belgrade, Serbia

- It was to be held in India originally but India lost the hosting rights after failing to pay the hosting fee last year.
- AIBA championship was hosted by Ekaterinburg, Russia in 2029 as well.
- AIBA president: Umar Kremlev

Legendary Indian sprinter Milkha Singh has tested positive for Covid-19 and is currently in home isolation at his Chandigarh residence. The 91-year-old is asymptomatic and claims to be in “high spirits”.

“A couple of our helpers earlier tested positive and so all the family members did the tests. Only I returned positive on 19/05/2021 and I am surprised,” Milkha told PTI.

“I have been telling people that doing physical exercise and remaining healthy is very important during this Covid times. I am 91 but I have been doing exercise regularly,” Milkha said.

Sports ministry invites online applications for National Sports Awards

The Sports Ministry on 20/05/2021 invited applications for the National Sports Awards, allowing eligible athletes, coaches, universities and other entities to self-nominate and apply online for a second year running of the Covid-19 pandemic. The last date of submitting applications is June 21st, 2021.

This year too like the last year has allowed self-nomination of applicants in view of the pandemic. National Sporting Federations will also nominate athletes for the top honors.

Last year 74 recipients were bestowed with the awards.

The prize money was also increased significantly with the Khel Ratna awardees receiving Rs. 25 lakh, Arjuna awardees Rs. 15 lakh, Dhronacharya (lifetime) Rs. 15 lakh, and Dhyanchand winners Rs. 10 lakhs.

Coach Monali Gorhe dies aged 44 of mucormycosis

A few hours before her death, her father Manohar Gorhe too succumbed to Covid-19.

Srinagar boy secures National Sports Champion Award

A 19-year-old athlete from Srinagar has been awarded the prestigious National Sports Champion Award 2021 by the National Sports and Physical Fitness Board in Martial Arts. Shahid Yousuf, originally hailing from the Soura area of Srinagar, and currently residing in Sumbal Sonawari, Bandipora, started his academic career at Javaidan Public School Soura.

His achievements include being an International Medalist- 2018, A+ State Referee TMDAJK & B Grade Coach- RSFI, 2 times Black Belt SRKDI and HKFI, 3 times National Player (1 Gold, 1 Silver & 1 Bronze Medal), 8 times State Player (5 Gold, 1 Silver & 1 Bronze Medal), 10 times District Player (6 Gold, 3 Silver & 1 Bronze Medal).

Also, during the Lockdown period, he received a Certificate of Honours for Fair Play from NSPFB, Gender Equality from IWOA, Corona Warrior by Charo'n Disha and Social Volunteer by World Sports TSD Federation. Moreover, he also received 8 different certificates during HSS and 9 during UG.

Hardik not considered; Kuldeep and Saini dropped for England tour

Hardik Pandya was not considered for selection as “he is still not in a position to bowl”, while a fit-again Ravindra Jadeja made his way back to a 20-strong Indian squad announced on Friday for next month’s World Test Championship final against New Zealand and a five-match series against England.

Out-of-form spinner Kuldeep Yadav and pacer Navdeep Saini have been left out of the squad, which is expected to depart for England for the twin assignments in the third week of this month.

The Test series against England will start in Nottingham, followed by matches at the Lord's (August 12 to 16), Leeds (August 25 to 29), The Oval (September 2 to 6) and Manchester (September 10 to 14).

- **Gathering Races 2021: Irregular viciousness marks casting a ballot in Kerala, Bengal; surveying generally quiet in TN, Assam, Pondicherry-**

New Delhi: Votes were polled in 1,53,538 Polling Stations spread across 475 Assembly Constituencies today, in the states of Kerala, Tamil Nadu, Puducherry and for third phase of Assam and West Bengal. The number of Polling Stations has increased in view of the fact that the number of voters per polling station has been reduced from 1,500 to 1,000 keeping social distancing norms in view.

The voter turnout In Assam was 82.28% and 84.21% in West Bengal. While 73.40% of the people voted in Kerala till 6 pm, neighbouring Tamil Nadu witnessed 62.86% during the period till 5 pm. 77.87% voters cast their votes in Puducherry

- **Complaint against BJP candidate for sporting lotus emblem on sari while voting in Tamil Nadu-**

Apr 06, 2021: A complaint on violation of the Model Code of Conduct was lodged against BJP candidate in Coimbatore South Constituency Vanathi Srinivasan for sporting a Lotus emblem while casting her vote here on Tuesday, official sources said.

The complaint was forwarded to the Chief Electoral Officer, Chennai for follow up, since lotus is the BJP symbol, official sources said.

- **Kerala Law minister files complaints with Election Commission against Opposition leader, NSS chief-**

Apr 06, 2021:

Kerala Law Minister AK Balan on Tuesday filed a complaint with the Election Commission against Leader of the Opposition Ramesh Chennithala and Nair Service Society chief G Sukumaran Nair for "misusing the traditions and names of Gods in an unprecedented manner" on polling day.

The Sabarimala women's entry issue, one of the major poll planks of the opposition UDF and the NDA against the ruling LDF during campaigning, took Centre stage even on Tuesday.

- **West Bengal political decision result LIVE: Mamata makes vow as CM for third term-**

New Delhi, 5May 2021-

West Bengal political race result 2021 LIVE updates: The Mamata Banerjee-drove Trinamool Congress (TMC) won 213 seats. The gathering, which had 209 individuals in the cordial Get together, improved its 2016 count. The state has a 294-part Gathering yet political race was canceled in Shamsheganj and Jangipur supporters because of the demise of up-and-comers. A gathering required 147 seats for a straightforward lion's share in the House with a successful strength of 292. Today, Mamata Banerjee will be making the vow as the main priest of the state for the third time in succession. The irregular chief, in any case, lost by 1,956 votes in Nandigram to previous protege-turned-BJP foe Suwendu Adhikari.

- **West Bengal election result LIVE: Mamata Banerjee to take oath as CM today-**

Kolkata:

A day after a spectacular victory in Bengal, Trinamool Congress supremo Mamata Banerjee has convened a meeting with all winning candidates on Monday at 4 PM at TMC Bhawan. Overcoming the might of the BJP after a bitter campaign, Mamata's TMC got an absolute majority winning more than 200 seats out of total 292 constituencies which went to the polls in eight phases between March 27-April 29. "It's a victory for Bengal's people it's 'Banglar joy' (Bengal's victory)," Banerjee told her party workers after her emphatic win. The BJP, on the other hand, was stymied in its ambitions of winning the state. The party bagged 77 constituencies. It is far less than the 120 assembly segments where it wrested a majority when it won 18 Lok Sabha seats in the 2019 general elections.

- **Nepal's EC discloses to PM Oli to gather information in single stage:**

Nepal's Election Commission has advised the government led by embattled Prime Minister K P Sharma Oli to conduct the mid-term elections slated for November 12 and 19 in a single phase to prevent the further spread of coronavirus infections during electioneering. After a meeting with Prime Minister K P Oli on Saturday, Chief Election Commissioner Dinesh Kumar Thapaliya said it is Election Commission's constitutional duty to successfully conduct polls once the date has been announced.

National Politics

Pinarayi Vijayan sworn in as Kerala chief minister for second time:

CPM leader Pinarayi Vijayan on Thursday took oath for a second consecutive term as chief minister of Kerala breaking the decades-old alternate shift of power between Left Democratic Front (LDF) and the United Democratic Front (UDF) in the state. Governor Arif Mohammed Khan administered the oath of office to 76-year-old Vijayan in a low-key function at the Central Stadium in Thiruvananthapuram, which was held completely in adherence with the Covid protocol. It is the second stint of the Marxist veteran in the top office.

BJP 'links' toolkit to Congress activist; Rahul says it's lying:

BJP and Congress on Wednesday remained locked in a high-decibel confrontation over the former's charge that the opposition party had orchestrated a campaign to malign the Modi government over the second wave of the Covid-19 pandemic by circulating a "toolkit" for amplification of its charges.

Even as BJP, disregarding Congress's threat of legal action, doubled down on its charge of fabricating a campaign linking the "toolkit" to a Congress insider, Rahul Gandhi accused BJP of spreading lies to divert attention from its failures. "Vaccines are in short supply and Covid deaths are increasing. The central government policy: Divert attention, spread lies, make a noise to hide facts," he tweeted.

Recall West Bengal governor, says Shiv Sena:

The Shiv Sena on Wednesday demanded that West Bengal governor Jagdeep Dhankar be immediately recalled, claiming that attempts were being made to create political instability in the state. The conduct of the West Bengal governor is "against the Constitution", an editorial in the Sena mouthpiece 'Saamana' alleged in the wake of the ongoing political tussle between the TMC-led state government and the opposition BJP.

Mamata wants change of governor:

West Bengal Chief Minister Mamata Banerjee has written to President and Prime Minister demanding a change of Governor in the interest of “good governance “ in the state . The letter comes immediately after the CBI arrested four Trinamool leaders, including two ministers, a former minister and a former Mayor in the Narada scam, on Monday. Governor Jagdeep Shankar has been on an unusual offensive against the Mamata government after the ruling Trinamool Congress won a landslide in this summer’s assembly polls.

Banerjee’s letters despatched on Tuesday alleges that Governor Shankar has been raking up an ‘exaggerated version’ of violence in West Bengal since the election.

BJP to boycott WB speaker’s election, not attend Assembly:

West Bengal BJP president Dilip Ghosh Friday said that party legislatures will boycott the election for the speaker in West Bengal assembly and its newly elected lawmakers will not attend the House till the post poll violence in the state is controlled. The speaker’s election is slated for Saturday. The BJP lawmakers will not attend the Assembly in protest against the post poll violence, he said.

Covid-19: Canada extends flight ban from India and Pakistan until June 21

Canada has extended the ban on direct flights from India and Pakistan till 21st June to arrest the spread of new variants of Covid-19 .Later, the transportation minister Mr. Omar Alghabra said that the restriction was imposed to protect the people from the new variants of Covid-19 and gave a statement that covid cases are reducing but it is not yet finished.

Pune teenager's 'clearest image of moon' goes viral on social media

Prathamesh Jaju, a 16-year-old boy from Pune gained so much popularity on social media by capturing the clearest images of the moon. He shot around 50,000 pictures and compiled them together for the clearest and sharpest view of the moon. It took 40 hours to do so.

Maharashtra facing shortage of mucormycosis injection

Maharashtra is facing shortage of mucormycosis injection and the Center should help in the allocation of 1.9 lakh injections. Rajesh Tope, the health minister of Maharashtra said that the disease black fungus and Covid-19 treatment would be provided free to ration card holders under its health insurance scheme, the Mahatma Jyotirao Phule Jan Arogya Yojana.

IMF proposes \$50 billion global vaccination

IMF has proposed a \$50 billion global vaccination plan that would cover 40% percent of the global population by the end of 2021 and at least 60% by the first half of 2022.IMF said that working with WHO, World Bank and Gavi has advanced targets and evaluated financial requirements and lays out practical action.
